10 Tips One Reason

- Define your defensible space.
- Reduce flammable brush around your home and under nearby trees.
- Prune or remove trees.
- Keep grass and weeds cut low.
- Clear wood piles and building materials away from your home.
- Keep your yard and roof clean.
- Keep address signs visible.
- Choose fire-resistant building materials and lawn furniture.
- Recycle yard debris avoid burning.
- Be prepared to respond to wildfire.

Prevention
